BATHROOM DO'S DON'TS

-  Use water efficiently and conserve whenever possible
-  Use single ply biodegradable toiletpaper
-  Use biodegradable shampoos and soaps
-  Don't flush anything except human waste and toilet paper

DISHWASHING DO'S DON'TS

-  Use dishwashing detergents that are concentrated, low-sudsing, phosphate-free and biodegradable
-  Use the garbage disposal - dispose of food waste in the garbage instead
-  Rinse grease down the sink
-  Pour any chemicals down the sink
-  Use detergents that contain phosphate (a chemical harmful to reefs)

LAUNDRY DO'S DON'TS

-  Wash laundry regularly rather than doing multiple loads in one day
-  Use laundry detergent that meets the EPA's Safer Choice Standard
-  Use chlorine bleach in the wash
